SMART CITY

Overall urban planning concepts and/or the increased use of ICT, especially with a view to improving citizens' quality of life and citizens' civil engagement.

GREEN CITY

Urban sustainability & 'green' issues.

SOCIAL FAIRNESS

Social entrepreneurship, social equality and livelihoods, ageing, migration, diversity.

CULTURE & CREATIVITY

Culture and creative industries, access to culture, culture as innovator/incubator of ideas.

KNOWLEDGE CITY

Collaborative creation of, access to and sharing of knowldge/information, citizens' involvement, urban labs and think tanks.
